

6. Residential Accommodation Medical Staff

The Minister for Health and Social Care to move -

That Tynwald approves of the Department of Health and Social Care incurring expenditure not exceeding £2,282,000 in respect of Medical Staff Residential Accommodation, Noble's Hospital, Braddan.

7. Education Act 2001

The Minister for Education and Children to move –

- 1. That Treasury make £503,000 funding available for the 2016-17 financial year, through the budget virement transfer of non-contributory benefits expenditure from Treasury's Social Security Division to the Department of Education and Children and,
- 2. That Tynwald further approves a permanent budget transfer from the Social Security Division's non-contributory benefits to the DEC of £740,000 from 2017-18 onwards in order to fund the ongoing cost of the increased provision of the pre-school credit voucher scheme. [MEMO]

8. Sea Services Agreement

The Minister for Infrastructure to move –

That Tynwald receives the report entitled "Liverpool Landing Stage/Strategic Sea Services Agreement" [GD No 2016/0045] and approves the following recommendations included within that report such that Tynwald:

- a) Endorses the eight strategic principles as being as follows:
- i. High quality sea transport is a critical element in serving international trade and services must be to appropriate international standards.
- ii. Reliable sea transport which has a proven record of operating safely at all times of the year in the challenging Irish Sea environment is a key requirement and has a critical impact on the quality of life and cost of living on the Island.
- iii. Long term arrangements that clarify future services and costs promote economic stability and increase certainty for businesses and consumers.
- iv. Direct and reliable sea transport service links to the main freight and passenger ports in adjacent jurisdictions must be retained to ensure rapid and direct access to centres of population and distribution, rail and trunk road infrastructure.
- v. Reduced duration of crossings and lower costs of travel encourage more frequent short stay travel, reduced business costs and faster delivery times.
- vi. The size of ferries and timing and frequency of sailings must provide sufficient capacity for the fluctuating daily demands of passengers and freight customers while recognising the operational constraints of Douglas harbour. This includes the provision of additional capacity for planned tourism events including the TT and other predictable short term seasonal peaks in demand.

vii. High quality terminals and vessels are a crucial element in providing prominent gateways to the Isle of Man, ensuring passenger comfort and creating a good first impression. This includes investing in public areas, customer service, customer information, and customer welcome.

viii. Government should work with stakeholders to encourage appropriate investment in the Isle of Man economy and Douglas harbour development through: marketing activity; protecting the Isle of Man's shipping lanes; supporting suitable expansion at strategically important ports; supporting improved transport links within the United Kingdom to the North West of England; promoting stability in Isle of Man maritime.

- b) agrees that these principles should form the basis of a new Strategic Sea Services Policy;
- c) requires the Department to present the new Strategic Sea Services Policy for Tynwald approval in November 2016;
- d) supports the Department spending a sum not exceeding £3.5 million for the purchase of a site at Princes Half-Tide Dock, Liverpool;
- e) endorses the Department's preferred option of seeking an open tender for a design and build contract to develop the facility but on the basis that no work should begin on developing the facility until agreement has been reached with a ferry service provider to operate from the facility;
- f) approves the Department negotiating a draft legal agreement to cover the development of a new Strategic Sea Services Agreement with the IOMSPCo, subject to a requirement that the Department brings the proposed legal agreement back to Tynwald for final approval and
- g) requires the Department to seek further concessions from IOMSPCo in relation to break clauses and the financial transparency of the company in the final Strategic Sea Services Agreement.

9. Douglas Bay Horse Tramway

The Minister for Infrastructure to move –

That Tynwald receives the Report "Proposals Regarding the Future Operation of Douglas Bay Horse Tramway" [GD No 2016/0046] and that the Report's recommendations are approved as follows:

(1) That Tynwald supports the Public Transport Division of the Department of Infrastructure operating the Douglas Bay Horse Tramway for 2017 and 2018.

- (2) That the Department of Infrastructure progresses discussions with Douglas Borough Council regarding the transfer of ownership of Strathallan tram depot to the Department, in its current state, for a nominal amount.
- (3) That the Department of Infrastructure works with Douglas Borough Council to facilitate the transfer of ownership of trams and horses initially to the Department of Infrastructure, prior to transfer to the new governance vehicle.
- (4) That following transfer of ownership the Department should undertake limited minor capital works to address urgent repairs to Strathallan tram depot to provide a temporary combined stables and tram depot.
- (5) That the business case for continuation of the Tramway and a new combined facility on the site of either the Strathallan tram depot or Derby Castle should continue to be evaluated during 2017 and 2018 Tramway operations.
- (6) That the new single line Tramway track should be laid from Derby Castle to the War Memorial as part of a Douglas Promenade highway scheme.
- (7) That a legal body should be established to provide a suitable vehicle to receive charitable donations to the Douglas Bay Horse Tramway.
- (8) That further investigation should be undertaken regarding the governance of the Douglas Bay Horse Tramway by a new arm's length governance vehicle.

10. Climate Challenge Mitigation Strategy

A Member for Environment, Food and Agriculture (Mr Peake) to move –

That the strategy document entitled Greater efficiency, Cleaner energy, Resilient economy – A Climate Challenge Mitigation Strategy for the Isle of Man 2016 – 2020 [GD No 2016/0031] be approved.

11. Review of the Functioning of Tynwald

The Chief Minister to move -

That Tynwald receives the Review of the Functioning of Tynwald [GD No 2016/0047]; notes the recommendations contained therein; and resolves that the recommendations be submitted to Tynwald for debate and decision after the next General Election.

12. High Level Strategic Review of Planning in the Isle of Man

The Minister for Policy and Reform to move –

That Tynwald receives the report by Envision 'High Level Strategic Review of Planning in the Isle of Man' and approves the report by Council of Ministers 'High Level Review of Planning in the Isle of Man' [GD No 2016/0048] [MEMO] and the recommendations contained therein:-

Recommendation 1

That the following Key Principles and Key Messages be used to direct any future reform of the Island's planning system:

Key Principle	Key Message
Be transparent, fair and free from abuse	Define the role of politicians in the planning process.
	Depoliticise the planning application process.
Be flexible and responsive to change	Prioritise major applications: local versus national.
	Reform legislation to provide flexibility and simplification, and to define the role of politicians in making guidance.
Be proportionate	Simplify the planning system through greater use of permitted development, reform of use classes and increased use of development orders.
Be simple and easy to use	Make the planning system more accessible and easier to understand for everyone – all documents to be simplified.
Be effective	Improve strategic planning and infrastructure planning and delivery.
	Provide greater resources to deliver a modern, simple, responsive and effective system.
Involve people	Improve the way public engagement takes place.
Meet the needs of, and benefits the whole community	This Key Principle relates to all of the Key Messages set out above.

Recommendation 2

That further work is undertaken in order to provide the new administration with options for how the planning system could be reformed which meet the agreed Key Principles and Key Messages set out in this stage of the review.

13. Digital Inclusion Strategy 2016-2021

The Minister for Policy and Reform to move –

That Tynwald approves the Digital Inclusion Strategy 2016-2021 [GD No 2016/0040] and supports the recommendation within:

That the Digital Inclusion Strategy 2016-2021 be endorsed, for the development of a shared vision on digital inclusion between public, private and voluntary sectors to tackle digital exclusion over the next five years.

14. Sea Defences, Flooding and Coastal Erosion Strategy

The Minister for Environment, Food and Agriculture to move –

That the strategy entitled National Strategy on Sea Defences, Flooding and Coastal Erosion [GD No 2016/0044] [MEMO], be received and approved and the associated Evidence Report is noted as an essential source of information and guidance in respect to ensuring the ongoing resilience of our communities and economy to weather and climate related damage.

15. A Strategy for the landscape and amenity of the Isle of Man

The Minister for Environment, Food and Agriculture to move –

That the document entitled "Our Landscape, Our Legacy – A Strategy for the landscape and amenity of the Isle of Man to 2050. Sustaining and maximising our natural wealth" [GD No 2016/0027] [MEMO] be received and serve as a general framework for the development of landscape policy across Government to 2050.

16. Chief Constable's Annual Report

The Minister for Home Affairs to move -

That the Chief Constable's Annual Report 2015-2016 be received [GD No 2016/0028].

17. The Future Manx State Pension

A Member of the Treasury (Mr Henderson) to move -

That the document entitled "The Future Manx State Pension, Treasury Proposals, July 2016" [GD No 2016/0036] be received and that the following proposals be approved:

In relation to the Single Tier State Pension, Treasury proposes to:

- introduce a single tier State Pension in the Island set at the rate of £170 per week (today's value);
- end the "Triple Lock" increase and base the future uprating of state pensions in their entirety on earnings in the Isle of Man (note: this does not apply to the Manx Pension Supplement see below);
- end the State Second Pension scheme;
- end the Retirement Pension Premium Scheme for new claimants from 6th April 2019;
- require 35 qualifying years of National Insurance contributions or credits for the full amount. There will also be a minimum qualifying period of 10 qualifying years. Those persons with fewer than 35 qualifying years but with more than the minimum 10 qualifying years will receive a proportion of the full amount;
- review the number of qualifying years required for a full pension every 10 years to ensure payments represent a fair contribution to the Manx National Insurance Fund (MNIF);
- continue with the current range of credits that enable those who cannot contribute to the new single tier pension to still build up entitlement;
- ensure that the UK/IOM Social Security agreement allows UK contributions/credits to counts towards the minimum qualifying period.

In relation to the transitional arrangements, Treasury will:

• ensure that a transitional process recognises individuals' entitlements accrued under the current rules.

In relation to the State Pension Age, Treasury propose to:

- review future State Pension Age increases after the UK have published their review into future increases in 2017;
- introduce legislation that will increase the State Pension Age in the Island to 67 between 2026 and 2028;
- investigate the feasibility of introducing a flexible claim date for the State Pension for those individuals whose SPA is increased to 67 between 2026 and 2028.

In relation to the Manx Pension Supplement, Treasury proposes to:

- phase out the Manx Pension Supplement for new claimants over a 20 year period starting in 2019;
- reduce the value of the Manx Pension Supplement for new claimants from 2019 by 5% each year;
- maintain the current residency conditions for payment of the Manx Pension Supplement;
- only uprate the Manx Pension Supplement when it is affordable to do so.

In relation to contracting-out, Treasury will:

issue a detailed consultation on the impact of ending contracting-out.

18. Environment and Infrastructure Policy Review Committee

The Chairman of the Environment and Infrastructure Policy Review Committee (Mr Wild) to move –

That the Second Report of the Environment and Infrastructure Policy Review Committee for the Session 2015-2016 — Statutory Procedure for Complaints Against Local Authorities [PP No 2016/0065] be received and that the following recommendations be approved —

Recommendation 1

That Tynwald requires the Council of Ministers to bring forward an amendment to the Act by 31st December 2016 to make provision for a right of appeal against a decision not to investigate.

Recommendation 2

That Tynwald calls on the Council of Ministers to undertake whatever work is necessary to ensure that a Tynwald Commissioner for Administration is appointed before 31st December 2016.

Recommendation 3

That the Council of Ministers must ensure that the Decision Status is correctly reported in the annual Tynwald Policy Decisions Report and that items are not removed before they are actually completed.

Recommendation 4

That recommendations not completed within 12 months of their approval by Tynwald must be updated to provide an expected completion date and the reason for delay explained.

Recommendation 5

That any recommendation of the Tynwald Commissioner for Administration, approved by Tynwald, must be actioned within 12 months, or sooner if specified, and that they will not be marked as completed until the Commissioner is satisfied.

19. Social Affairs Policy Review Committee: Social Care Procurement

The Chairman of the Social Affairs Policy Review Committee (Mr Cretney) to move –

That the First Report of the Social Affairs Policy Review Committee for the Session 2015/16 – Social Care Procurement [PP No 2016/0072] be received and that the following recommendations be approved –

Recommendation 1

That Tynwald is of the opinion that it is of the utmost importance that Accounting Officers be familiar with all regulations and procedures pertaining to the procurement process.

Recommendation 2

That Treasury should develop proposals for ensuring the regulations and procedures pertaining to the procurement process are fully understood by officers, and report to Tynwald.

Recommendation 3

That Treasury should consider implementing background checks on officers involved in the procurement process, and report to Tynwald.

Recommendation 4

That Treasury should develop a policy on social value in the procurement process, including a clear definition of what is to be understood by this term, and report back to Tynwald.

Recommendation 5

That any social value policy should as far as possible recognise the particular advantages of contracting with longstanding Manx organisations.

20. Planning and Building Control

The Chairman of the Select Committee on Planning and Building Control (Petition for Redress) (Mr Thomas) to move –

That the Report of The Select Committee on Planning and Building Control (Petition for Redress) 2015-16 [PP No 2016/0076] be received and that the following recommendations be approved —

Recommendation 1

That the Council of Ministers' Environment and Infrastructure Committee planning review revisits the commitment to Tynwald and sets out in its report to Tynwald in July 2016 how it intends to ensure this is met in a subsequent stage of its review.

Recommendation 2

That the 'Pre application Guidance for Customers' should be updated to make it clear that the planning officer providing advice at this stage will not be the planning officer who determines the application, in the event that the application does not go to the Planning Committee, and to explain why this is the case.

Recommendation 3

That all of the criteria setting out who will determine planning applications should be added to the planning advice section of the Government website in a format which will be easy for the public to find and understand.

Recommendation 4

That guidance for applicants should include a clear explanation of the significance of land classification and which policies may be considered in relation to the various types.

Recommendation 5

That the Council of Ministers' Environment and Infrastructure Sub Committee Planning Review should look closely at the process followed during the preparation of future area plans to ensure that the significance of land classification and re-classification is highlighted.

Recommendation 6

That the Council of Ministers' Environment and Infrastructure Sub Committee Planning Review should look closely at what the Department must have regard to under Section 10 (4) of the 1999 Act, in addition to the development plan, and consider bringing it all together into one series of papers, probably Planning Policy Statements, to improve clarity, with periodic review dates of such papers to confirm continued suitability and relevance.

Recommendation 7

That the Planning Policy Unit in the Cabinet Office give consideration to introducing a mechanism to allow for the adaptation or re-interpretation of policies, such as Housing Policy 14, which may include consultation with a body established under Section 40 of the 1999 Act, where experience shows that professional interpretation is frequently contradictory, without waiting for a full review of Strategic or Development Plans.

Recommendation 8

That the Department reword Section 8 (7) (d) of the Standing Orders to replace the words 'only if invited to do so and' with 'but'. It will read 'the applicant and/or agent or any third party may address the Committee but only to provide factual clarification of any matter relevant to the planning application which is the subject of the site visit;'.

Recommendation 9

That the Council of Ministers' Environment and Infrastructure Sub Committee Planning Review should consider how the planning process at appeal can be streamlined, taking note of the suggestions in this report.

Recommendation 10

That the Department amend legislation to remove the third party interested person's right of appeal after determination if they have not made their objections known during the application process, prior to determination.

Recommendation 11

Further that the Council of Ministers' Environment and Infrastructure Sub Committee Planning Review consider removing the third party interested person status altogether.

Recommendation 12

That as soon as the Department is made aware that action of any sort may be taken against it with respect to a planning application, the applicants and any interested parties should be notified.

Recommendation 13

That the Department introduce a target timescale for redetermination decisions to be made, which should be no more than 8 weeks after the date of a judgment or consent order.

Recommendation 14

That Tynwald calls on the Council of Ministers to undertake whatever work is necessary to ensure that a Tynwald Commissioner for Administration is appointed without delay.

Recommendation 15

That the Council of Ministers' Environment and Infrastructure Sub Committee Planning Review give consideration to changing the way in which departmental planning applications are decided to ensure parity of transparency with respect to other planning decisions.

Recommendation 16

That the Council of Ministers' Environment and Infrastructure Sub Committee Planning Review give consideration to defining criteria for 'national importance' as described in the 1999 Act.

Recommendation 17

That the Council of Ministers' Environment and Infrastructure Sub Committee Planning Review give consideration to including consideration of enforcement matters in their review.

Recommendation 18

That the results of the planning review led by the Council of Ministers' Environment and Infrastructure Committee, the recommendations from this report and the outcome of the cases considered but not reported on here, are referred to the Environment and Infrastructure Policy Review Committee of Tynwald for future scrutiny.

21. Select Committee on the Registration of Land (Petition for Redress)

The Chairman of the Select Committee on the Registration of Land (Petition for Redress) to move –

That the Report of the Select Committee on the Registration of Land (Petition for Redress) [PP No 2016/0078] be received and that the following recommendations be approved —

Recommendation 1

That legislation be introduced to require that before any land is voluntarily registered, notice should be served on any interested parties who can be identified and advertised on the land concerned in the same way as a planning application.

Recommendation 2

That legislation be introduced to require that where any land is subject to compulsory registration triggered by a transaction where the parties are represented by the same advocate, notice should be served on any interested parties who can be identified and advertised on the land concerned in the same way as a planning application.

22. Public Sector Pensions Act 2011
