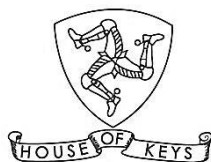

How the decision to site a semi-permanent shop structure for MNH products at the Sea Terminal was reached; what the cost of installation was; and what the anticipated annual expenditures and revenues will be?

How the Isle of Man road traffic casualty rate (based on those killed or seriously injured) compares with (a) other crown dependencies and (b) countries in the European Union?

5. The Hon. Member for Douglas East (Miss Bettison) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

What de-icer stock is usually retained at the airport; what shelf life the de-icer has; what maximum storage levels are and the associated costs of storage; and what the failure to de-ice planes has cost over the last 5 years?
