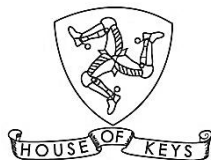

What action he has taken, or is proposing to take, to ascertain the opinion and interests of Manx residents regarding Brexit; and if he will make a statement?
2. The Hon. Member for Onchan (Mr Callister) to ask the Chief Minister –

What part the Energy from Waste Plant plays in the Climate Change Emergency Strategy?
3. The Hon. Member for Douglas South (Mrs Beecroft) to ask the Chief Minister –

If he will make a statement on the infringement proceedings by the EU Commission against the United Kingdom Government in relation to the VAT treatment of aircraft in the Isle of Man?
4. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –

How many graduates who were educated on the Island returned to the Island in the last five years?

5. The Hon. Member for Onchan (Ms Edge) to ask the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –

What student funding is available for students after school leaving age?

6. The Hon. Member for Onchan (Mr Callister) to ask the Minister for Environment, Food and Agriculture –

Pursuant to his announcement of 20th May 2019, how many of the Island's households will be eligible for the Energy Efficiency Scheme?

7. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for Environment, Food and Agriculture –

How many firms have been awarded a provenance label for a) product of the Isle of Man and b) made in the Isle of Man?

What role the Island played at the International UNESCO Biosphere conference recently held in Dublin?

9. The Hon. Member for Onchan (Mr Callister) to ask the Minister for Home Affairs –

When the Licensing Act 1995 will be updated; and if the Minister will make a statement?

10. The Hon. Member for Douglas Central (Mrs Corlett) to ask the Minister for Home Affairs –

Whether his Department is considering bringing forward legislation to provide a domestic abuse disclosure scheme?

11. The Hon. Member for Ayre and Michael (Mr Baker) to ask the Chairman of the Post Office –

How many post offices were operating within the Isle of Man Post Office retail network at 31st May in each year from 2000 to 2019; and how many the Chairman expects to be operating at 31st May in each year from 2020 to 2025?

2. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for Policy and Reform –

Pursuant to his Answer of 14th May, of the Government employees who received such lump sums of above £100,000 in each of the last five years a) what the highest sum paid was b) what the lowest sum paid was c) how many such payments were made d) what the average sum paid was; and how many of those who received such payments subsequently returned to work for the Isle of Man Government?

3. The Hon. Member for Douglas South (Mrs Beecroft) to ask the Minister for Policy and Reform –

If he will list the public assets sold since October 2011 with a value in excess of £100,000; to whom they were sold; and what the sale prices were?

4. The Hon. Member for Douglas South (Mrs Beecroft) to ask the Minister for Policy and Reform –

Pursuant to his oral Answer on 14th May, how many of the settlement agreements contained confidentiality clauses?

5. The Hon. Member for Douglas East (Miss Bettison) to ask the Minister for Enterprise –

How many of the views of the fairy houses story have prompted visits to the Island; and how his Department assesses such economic benefit?

6. The Hon. Member for Douglas South (Mrs Beecroft) to ask the Minister for Enterprise –

What legislation was used to extend the terms of the repayment of the tourist grant to the Sefton Group; and who made that decision?

7. The Hon. Member for Douglas South (Mrs Beecroft) to ask the Minister for Enterprise –

Whether the balance of the tourist grant to the Sefton Group was repaid; whether a new facility for the same amount and with the same terms was granted to Douglas Hotel Holdings Limited; what legislation was relied on to complete the transactions; what conditions Douglas Hotel Holdings Limited have to comply with; and who the beneficial owner is of Douglas Hotel Holdings Limited?

8. The Hon. Member for Onchan (Ms Edge) to ask the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –

How many vacancies there were in each school at the end of May 2019; and how many staff have been recruited to start in September 2019?

9. The Hon. Member for Onchan (Mr Callister) to ask the Minister for Environment, Food and Agriculture –

What the average CO₂ emissions were from the Energy from Waste Plant in each year since 2008?

10. The Hon. Member for Onchan (Ms Edge) to ask the Minister for Health and Social Care –

Whether patients receiving treatment at Clatterbridge are entitled to have a family member or friend accompany them during treatment periods?

11. The Hon. Member for Onchan (Ms Edge) to ask the Minister for Health and Social Care –

What costs were associated with off island treatment claimed by patients broken down by a) boat b) plane c) accommodation d) mileage e) taxis and f) other in each of the last five years?

When and why the Director of Nursing position was created; what the specification for the role is; what recruitment process was followed; and how many applicants there were?

15. The Hon. Member for Douglas East (Miss Bettison) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

If he will publish and make a statement on the public sector housing qualification policy?

16. The Hon. Member for Douglas East (Miss Bettison) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

What the cost of the temporary marquee to house the horse trams was; and whether the structure was leased or purchased?

17. The Hon. Member for Onchan (Mr Callister) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

How many passengers the horse trams carried during the 2019 TT Period?

18. The Hon. Member for Onchan (Mr Callister) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

What the running costs for the horse trams during the 2019 TT fortnight were?

If he will provide a breakdown of all network failures by a) type of failure and b) cost of repairs, broken down by labour and materials, in each of the last five years?

COMMUNICATIONS BILL 2018

**CONSIDERATION OF COUNCIL
AMENDMENTS**

The Council passed this Bill with amendments.

Mr Malarkey will move that the Keys disagree with amendments 1 and 4 in the following list, with a view to a Conference under Keys Standing Order 4.13(4)(d) but concur with the remainder under paragraph (4)(a) of that Standing Order. Page and line references are to the Bill as reprinted for Legislative Council.

AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 2

1. Page 17, after line 21 insert—

“(c) section [NC1]¹ (Chair of the Commission);”.

Renumber the subsequent paragraphs of subsection (3) of the Clause accordingly.

AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 3

2. Page 23, for lines 10 to 13 substitute—

“**public service broadcaster**” means one or more licenceholders upon whom public service broadcasting obligations are imposed, being—

- (a) Radio Manx Limited, a company incorporated under the Companies Acts 1931-2004 with the company number 001486C;
- (b) another licenceholder specified in an order made by the Council of Ministers;
- (c) both the company mentioned in paragraph (a) and one or more licenceholders specified as mentioned in paragraph (b); or
- (d) two or more licenceholders specified as mentioned in paragraph (b);”.

AMENDMENTS TO CLAUSE 8

3. Page 29, omit from the beginning of line 27 to “appropriate,” in line 28.

INSERTION OF NEW CLAUSE 1

4. Page 29, after line 33—

“NC1 Chair of the Commission

- (1) Not later than the third anniversary of the coming into operation of this section, the Council of Ministers must by order under this section amend the Communications Commission Order 1989² to provide that —
 - (a) the chair of the Commission is to be a person who is not a member of Tynwald; and
 - (b) in recommending members of the Commission for appointment the Appointments Commission and the Council of Ministers must have regard to the importance of demonstrating compliance with the 7 principles of public life (commonly known as “the Nolan principles”³) and that members of the Commission are —
 - (i) politically independent; and
 - (ii) commercially independent.
- (2) After the coming into operation of the order required by subsection (1), the powers in section 5 of the *Statutory Boards Act 1987* as read with paragraph 2 of Schedule 1 to the *Government Departments Act 1987* may not be exercised so as to reverse the effect of that subsection.

Renumber the succeeding clauses of the Bill and adjust cross-references accordingly.

#AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 36

5. Page 45, omit from the beginning of line 11 to “appropriate,” in line 12.

AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 74

6. Page 61, omit lines 34 to 36 (which constitute subsection (5) of the Clause).
Renumber the following subsections and adjust cross-references accordingly.

7. Page 67, line 8 at the beginning insert “confirming”.

8. Page 75, omit from the beginning of line 1 to “appropriate,” in line 2.

AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 152

9. Page 121, for lines 19 to 23 substitute—
- “(3) Before making any regulations or order under this Act, the Council of Ministers or the Commission (as the case requires) must consult—
- (a) every licenceholder that may be affected by the regulations or order; and
 - (b) such other persons or bodies as the body proposing to make the regulations or order considers appropriate.”.
