1. QUESTIONS FOR ORAL ANSWER

1. The Hon Member for Michael (Mr Cannan) to ask the Chief Minister –
Has the marketing slogan “Freedom to Flourish” now been discarded as official Government policy?

2. The Hon Member for Michael (Mr Cannan) to ask the Minister for Local Government and the Environment –
 - (1) Is your Department fully satisfied at the Department of Transport using a hangar in the Jurby Industrial Estate to store untreated sewage; and
 - (2) is your Department fully satisfied that the Department of Transport using a hangar for the storage of raw sewage is not detrimental to the policy of encouraging investment and refurbishment of the industrial estate in order to attract the establishment of manufacturing and other industries?

3. The Hon Member for Peel (Mr Crookall) to ask the Minister for Local Government and the Environment –
 - (1) What is the cost of the removal of the leachate annually from the Raggatt Landfill site, Glenfaba;
 - (2) how long will it continue for; and
 - (3) why cannot the leachate go straight into the River Neb to save on costs?

4. The Hon Member for Michael (Mr Cannan) to ask the Minister for Health Social Security –

Having received a Petition in support of the re-instatement in your Department's Capital and Revenue expenditure programme for the provision of a General Medical Practice Surgery at Kirk Michael, what are your intentions in respect of this matter?

5. The Hon Member for Douglas North (Mr Henderson) to ask the Minister for Health and Social Security –

What hope have patients on the 'Orthodontic waiting list' of ever receiving treatment or gaining an appointment?

6. The Hon Member for Onchan (Mr Karran) to ask the Minister for Health and Social Security –

How many residents in nursing homes are having to pay all their entire costs including their pocket money to stay in that accommodation?

7. The Hon Member for Michael (Mr Cannan) to ask the Minister for Transport –

Can you explain why the Douglas Harbour Control has to be re-developed to accept 999 calls when the Emergency Services Joint Control Room came into operation in April 2004 at a total cost of £2,995,000.00?

What are the projected additional costs for –

- (1) Setting up;
- (2) the annual running costs of a marine operation centre to replace the service given by Liverpool Coastguard; and
- (3) how can such additional costs be justified?

9. The Hon Member for Malew and Santon (Mr Cregeen) to ask the Minister for Transport –

What initiatives has your Department implemented or considered to increase road safety throughout the year?

10. The Hon Member for Onchan (Mr Karran) to ask the Minister for Transport –

Since your Department is party to the user agreement with the Isle of Man Steam Packet Company, can you inform this Hon House what is the turnover and profit for the Isle of Man Steam Packet business from their monopoly under that such agreement?

Will the proceeds of the recent sales of land by the owners of the Steam Packet Company be spent on reinvestment to provide a better service for the company's passengers?
