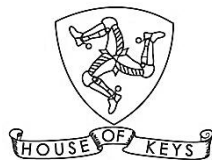

Pursuant to his answer in September 2020, what plans he has to use the vacant Park Road site for a replacement primary school for Scoill Yn Jubillee?

3. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –

What recent direct contact the Education Service has made with Manx students studying off Island regarding their plans to return at Christmas?

4. The Hon. Member for Onchan (Ms Edge) to ask the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –

If he will make a statement on spending on the free school meal scheme set up during Covid-19?

5. The Hon. Member for Ramsey (Mr Hooper) to ask the Chairman of the Post Office –

What plans she has to implement a parcel collection service similar to that recently introduced by Royal Mail in the UK?

6. The Hon. Member for Onchan (Ms Edge) to ask the Chief Minister –

If he will make a statement on meetings of the Council of Ministers and the advice received relating to returning students and family visits at Christmas?

7. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for the Treasury –

On how many occasions the Energy from Waste Plant has been sold; and for how much?

What progress has been made with introducing work place pensions; and if he will make a statement?

2. Questions for Written Answer

1. The Hon. Member for Douglas Central (Mr Thomas) to ask the Chief Minister –

What progress has been made: a) to introduce National Policy Directives which enable sustainable economic development to meet the community needs in urban and rural areas; b) to review the use of Compulsory Purchase powers and the reduction in rate discounts associated with brownfield sites to stimulate early development; and c) to launch the new Community Infrastructure Levy?

2. The Hon. Member for Douglas South (Mr Quine) to ask the Minister for the Treasury –

Whether crew members on Isle of Man Steam Packet Company vessels who are employed by third party agencies pay National Insurance and Income Tax to the Isle of Man Treasury?

3. The Hon. Member for Douglas Central (Mr Thomas) to ask the Minister for Policy and Reform –

What planning approvals have been taken up in (a) brownfield and (b) greenfield sites in the last year; and how much residential land is available?

4. The Hon. Member for Douglas Central (Mr Thomas) to ask the Minister for Policy and Reform –

What progress the Community Infrastructure Levy working group has made with: a) viability research and analysis using specialist consultants; b) agreement of policy on types of development and location the levy is to be sought from; c) a report on wider financial implications; d) policy on what monies raised should be used for and the mechanism for the delivery of those projects; and e) drafting and consultation on Regulations?

5. The Hon. Member for Douglas Central (Mr Thomas) to ask the Minister for Policy and Reform –

How many sites were submitted in response to the call for sites in the north and west, broken down by land use?

6. The Hon. Member for Douglas Central (Mr Thomas) to ask the Minister for Policy and Reform –

If he will re-publish the Requests for Information for Emergency Housing – Day Time Drop-in and Night Stop Facility and the Manx Housing First Support Service; and what the timetable is for considering responses and taking signposting, emergency housing and supported living projects forward, including budget elements?

7. The Hon. Member for Douglas Central (Mr Thomas) to ask the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –

Pursuant to his answer of 27 October: a) how the staff turnover rate at University College Isle of Man compares to that: i) in previous years; ii) in Island schools and iii) in the whole public service; and b) what exit interviews were held; and if he will make a statement?

8. The Hon. Member for Ramsey (Mr Hooper) to ask the Minister for Environment, Food and Agriculture –

How many planning applications are: a) waiting for an appeal hearing or written appeal process to complete; and b) waiting for a Ministerial or Departmental Determination; and how long each application has been waiting for a Determination?

9. The Hon. Member for Douglas South (Mr Quine) to ask the Minister for Environment, Food and Agriculture –

When the last survey of the sea bed around the Manx coastline out to a distance of three miles was carried out?

10. The Hon. Member for Onchan (Ms Edge) to ask the Minister for Health and Social Care –

How many unannounced inspections of care home facilities there have been in each of the last four years, broken down by facility; what reports and subsequent inspections there have been in each case; and when the next inspections are scheduled?

Pursuant to the answers provided on 20th November 2012, what information regarding section 13 agreements and commuted sums for affordable housing he has received since then, in particular regarding: a) how many commuted sums have been agreed; b) to which developments they relate; c) how much money has been received in the Housing Reserve Fund or elsewhere as commuted sums arising from these agreements; and d) which housing schemes have received monies from these commuted funds; and if he will make a statement about the policy regarding use of monies raised from section 13 agreement commuted sums?

“(2) In the following provisions, for “Cabinet Office” there is substituted “Council of Ministers” —

- (a) section 51B(1);
- (b) section 51C(1);
- (c) section 51D(1);
- (d) section 51G(7);
- (e) section 51H(6);
- (f) section 51L(3) and (4);
- (g) section 51M(2) and (10);
- (h) section 51N(1);
- (i) section 51(O)(1)(b), (c) and (d);
- (j) section 51PA;
- (k) section 51Q(1).”

“30 Amendment of the Emergency Powers Act 1936

(1) The Emergency Powers Act 1936 is amended as follows.

(2) In section 4A (continuation of emergency regulations), after subsection (3) there is inserted —

“(3A) Tynwald may, in approving continuation regulations, amend them.”
