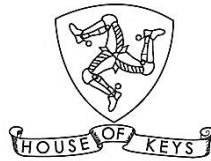

1. Questions for Oral Answer

1. The Hon. Member for Douglas Central (Mrs Corlett) to ask the Minister for Home Affairs –

What action his Department will take to encourage organizations and businesses that have an online presence to adopt the use of a discreet portal to provide support, advice and contact information for those experiencing domestic abuse?

2. The Hon. Member for Douglas South (Mr Quine) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

What the terms of reference are for the consultants Lemaurey engaged at Ronaldsway Airport; how they were selected; and how much the consultancy has cost?

3. The Hon. Member for Douglas Central (Mr Thomas) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

Pursuant to his answers provided on 27th October 2020, why Bus Vannin has not adopted the Confederation of Passenger Transport voluntary Code of Practice for the use and acceptance of mobility scooters on low floor buses; and why Bus Vannin will not allow Class 2 mobility scooters on its buses?

What recent representations he has made to universities which are refusing to reduce the amount students have to pay for their accommodation?

What regulations apply to the occupation of tourist accommodation for a continuous period exceeding one month, including flats; and if he will make a statement about the registration requirements and housing standards for such occupation?

How many a) flats and b) houses in multiple occupation have been registered with each registration authority at the end of each calendar year since 2014; and if he will make a statement about the efficiency and effectiveness of the process of i) setting standards for this type of premises and ii) requiring any person intending to use or to permit to be used such premises to apply to register the premises?

7. The Hon. Member for Ramsey (Mr Hooper) to ask the Minister for Health and Social Care –

How many full time equivalent GP Partners there were in each of the last ten years?

8. The Hon. Member for Ramsey (Mr Hooper) to ask the Minister for Health and Social Care –

How many full time equivalent a) salaried GPs and b) consultants at Noble's hospital there were in each of the last ten years?

9. The Hon. Member for Ramsey (Mr Hooper) to ask the Minister for Health and Social Care –

What legislative changes are needed to enable an Electronic Prescription Service; and what plans he has to bring these before Tynwald or the Branches for consideration?

10. The Hon. Member for Douglas Central (Mr Thomas) to ask the Minister for Health and Social Care –

Whether a revised report on COVID-19 antibody testing on the Isle of Man will be issued including an adjustment for the acknowledged statistical bias in the sample; and what plans he has for a formal population study as recommended in the Preliminary Report dated July 2020?

How much daily supply passed through the sub-sea cable for on-Island usage and what the minimum and maximum amounts utilised were, in each of the last five years?

How many Megawatts were generated and supplied to the Manx Utilities Authority from the Energy from Waste plant in the last twelve months?

AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 19

1. Page 63, line 5, for “2 years custody” substitute **5** years’ custody **2**.

AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 24

2. Page 66, line 6, after subsection (3)(c) insert —

(d) the degree of B’s vulnerability in any case where B is under the age of 18 and his or her ability to protect himself or herself from physical or psychological harm is significantly impaired through physical or mental disability or illness, through intellectual, physiological or psychiatric impairment or otherwise; **2**.

Renumber the following paragraphs accordingly.

AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 87

3. Page 105, lines 6 to 13, substitute —

(5) The duty outlined in this section does not apply so long as, in relation to the discovered act of sexual abuse, that person complies with a safeguarding policy prescribed for the purposes of this section in regulations made by the Department. **2**.

AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 88

4. Page 106, line 12, for “explore, develop and affirm substitute **2** explore, develop or affirm freely **2**.

AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 111

5. Page 123, line 10, after “enabling” insert **“A or ”**.
6. Page 123, line 14, after subsection (2) insert —
 - (3)** A person (A) commits an offence if —
 - (a) A operates equipment beneath the clothing of another person (B) with the intention of enabling A or another person to observe, for the purpose of obtaining sexual gratification the private parts of B; and
 - (b) A knows that B does not consent to A operating equipment with that intention.
 - (4)** For the purposes of subsections (2) and (3), A is taken to be operating equipment if A enables or secures its activation by B or any other person without B’s or that other person’s consent. **”**.

AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 159

13. Page 161, lines 13 to 29 for subsections (1) to (3) substitute —

- 13**(1) A person gives a notification under section 154(1), 155(1), 156(1) or 157(2) to (6) by giving a notification to such person and in such manner as the Department may prescribe by regulations.

The regulations must prescribe, in addition to other means, a means of electronic communication (within the meaning of the *Electronic Transactions Act 2000*).

Tynwald procedure — approval required.

- (2) A notification given in accordance with this section must be acknowledged—
- (a) in writing, and
 - (b) in such form as the Department may direct.
- (3) When a person (“P”) gives a notification under section 154(1), 155(1), 156(1) or 157(2) to (6), P must, if requested to do so by the person to whom notification is given, attend at a police station specified by that person and allow that person to do any of the following things —
- (a) take P’s fingerprints;
 - (b) photograph, or otherwise produce an image of, P or any part of P.
- (4) The power in subsection (3) is exercisable for the purpose of verifying P’s identity. **22**.

- 13**(b) if a young offender is required to attend at a police station under section 159(3), the parent must ensure that the young offender attends at the police station and the parent must attend at the police station with the young offender. **22**.
