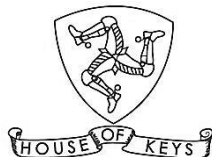

What plans he has to review a) the basis for the rating of quarries and mines and b) the royalties system?

2. The Hon. Member for Rushen (Dr Haywood) to ask the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –

What arrangements are in place to ensure safe working conditions in educational settings; and what consultation has been undertaken with unions on this?

3. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for Enterprise –

What discussions have been held with the Treasury about extending TT homestay tax advantages to other events?

Annex 1: Amendments to Standing Orders

1. To replace Standing Order 3.2 with the following words
“House of Keys Smooïnaght
 - (1) Before the commencement of business, a contributor nominated by a Member and approved by the Speaker may deliver a short address, to be known as the House of Keys Smooïnaght, in line with guidance issued by the Speaker.
 - (2) If no address is given, a short period of silence may be kept at the discretion of the Speaker.”
2. To leave out Standing Orders 9.4.1 and 9.4.2.
3. To leave out the word “Chaplain” in Standing Order 11.6.1.
