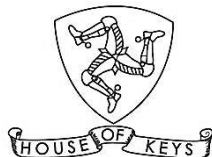

#### 1. Questions

1. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Chief Minister –

What assessment has been made of the impact of flight cancellations on the Island's reputation.

2. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Chief Minister –

What progress has been made with the development of the Airport Technology Gateway, and who is responsible for driving this initiative forward.

3. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Chief Minister –

How many committees and subcommittees established by the Council of Ministers are currently sitting.

4. The Hon. Member for Onchan (Mr Callister) to ask the Minister for Health and Social Care –

How many people are on the waiting list for a hip operation; and what the average time is from referral to treatment.

5. The Hon. Member for North Douglas (Mr Ashford) to ask the Minister for Health and Social Care –

What progress has been made on the development and implementation of an autism pathway.

6. The Hon. Member for North Douglas (Mr Wannenburgh) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

Whether he is satisfied that adequate planning was in place to ensure all public transport services over the TT period; what deviations were experienced during that period; and what if any impact there has been on bus drivers' morale.

7. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

What Bus Vannin's policy is on informing bus users about cancellations and delays.

8. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

How many bus services in May 2022 were operated by non-contracted bus drivers, and of these how many were operated by a) supervisors and managers; b) administrative staff; c) non-contract employees; d) off-Island recruits; and e) others.

9. The Hon. Member for Rushen (Dr Haywood) to ask the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –

What plans she has for modifications to schools to reduce disease transmission ahead of the predicted autumn and winter wave of Covid infections; and whether this work will be completed before the autumn term.

10. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –

How many teaching staff resigned on or before the final day for doing this during the academic year 2021/22.

11. The Hon. Member for North Douglas (Mr Ashford) to ask the Minister for Environment, Food and Agriculture –

What plans there are to update section 24 of the Building Control Act 1991 and the rest of that Act.

12. The Hon. Member for North Douglas (Mr Ashford) to ask the Chair of the Planning Committee –

What consideration is given by the Planning Committee to mast sharing when it is deciding whether to approve an application for a mobile phone mast; and if she will make a statement.

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**CONSIDERATION OF CLAUSES**

Dr Haywood to move —

**AMENDMENTS TO CLAUSE 28**

1. Page 22, for lines 8 and 9 substitute —

- «(1) The Chief Registrar has the function of establishing and maintaining a register of delegates.
- (2) Any person may, by an application made under subsection (3), request the Chief Registrar to carry out a search of the register.
- (3) An application must, —
  - (a) state, —
    - (i) the name of the person to whom the application relates, and
    - (ii) such other details about that person as the Chief Registrar may require for the purpose of carrying out the search, and
  - (b) be accompanied by any fee prescribed in regulations made by the Department.
- (4) The Chief Registrar may require the applicant to provide such further information, or produce such documents, as the Chief Registrar reasonably considers necessary to enable the Chief Registrar to carry out the search.
- (5) As soon as reasonably practicable after receiving the application, —
  - (a) the Chief Registrar must by certificate notify the applicant of the result of the search, and
  - (b) in the event that it reveals one or more entries on the register, the Chief Registrar must disclose to the applicant all the information appearing on the register in respect of each entry.
- (6) The Chief Registrar may, upon a request in writing, supply any person with an office copy of a registered instrument if the Chief Registrar is satisfied that the person making the request has a good

- reason for doing so and it is not reasonably practicable to obtain a copy of the instrument from the delegate.
- (7) “Office copy” means a true copy of the original marked by the Chief Registrar as being an office copy.».

### AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 33

2. Page 24, line 17, for “the Attorney General and the Deemsters” substitute «the Attorney General, the Deemsters and such other person as it considers appropriate.».

### AMENDMENTS TO CLAUSE 41

3. Page 28, line 10, after “may” insert «, with the concurrence of the Director of Public Health.».

### AMENDMENTS TO CLAUSE 45

4. Page 30, line 19, for “or revising” substitute «, revising or approving».
5. Page 30, line 21, after “issue” insert «or approve» .
6. Page 30, line 23, after “issued” insert «, revised or approved».

### AMENDMENTS TO CLAUSE 51

7. Page 34, after line 32 insert the following —
- «(5) In this section —
- (a) “Act of Parliament” also includes an Act of the Scottish Parliament, the National Assembly for Wales or the Northern Ireland Assembly; and
- (b) “the United Kingdom” also includes a part of the United Kingdom.».

### AMENDMENTS TO SCHEDULE 1

8. Page 39, in line 5, for “court rules” substitute «section 81 of the *Interpretation Act 2015*».
9. Page 40, in line 27, omit “(whether or not on application of the Chief Registrar)”.
