

Carriage of Animals between Ports in Great Britain and the Isle of Man.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries of Great Britain have issued an Order, known as "The Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912," which will come into operation on the 1st of July, 1912, making regulations relating to vessels on board of which animals are carried from a port in Great Britain, or to any such port from a port in Ireland or the Isle of Man, as well as to the animals so carried.

The provisions of the Order relate to the protection of animals while being carried on vessels, as well as to the cleaning and disinfection of vessels and all appliances used in connection with the removal of animals.

The Order will, on its coming into force, supersede "The Isle of Man Animals Order of 1896."
