



OUTBREAK OF FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE IN CUMBERLAND.

A NOTIFICATION has been received from the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries of an outbreak of Foot-and-Mouth Disease at Belmont, near Penrith, in Cumberland. The cattle and sheep on the farm have been slaughtered, and an Order has been issued by the Board prohibiting the movement of all animals over a wide area around the affected premises.

In view of the large traffic in cattle and other animals which is carried on between the northern ports of England and this Island, and with the object of preventing the introduction into the Island of foot and mouth disease, farmers and others are strongly warned against importing cattle and other animals from the North of England.
