



## COPYRIGHT ACT, 1912.

A PROCLAMATION, dated the 5th July, 1912, has been issued by HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor under the authority of the Insular Copyright Act, 1912, proclaiming the Copyright Act, 1911 (being an Act of the Imperial Parliament) to be in full force and operation as law within this Island as from the date of such Proclamation.

**A PROCLAMATION.**

---

WHEREAS, an Act intituled "The Copyright Act, 1911," has been passed by the Imperial Parliament, amending and consolidating the law relating to copyright, and such Act is declared by the provisions thereof (except where such provisions are expressly restricted to the United Kingdom) to extend throughout His Majesty's dominions and to come into operation in the manner therein expressed :

And whereas it is provided by section 37, sub-section (2), of the said Act that such Act shall come into operation in any British possession to which the same extends, other than those named in paragraphs (b) and (c) of the said sub-section, on the proclamation thereof within the possession by the Governor :

And whereas it is desirable that the provisions of the said Act (except such as are expressly restricted to the United Kingdom) should come into operation in this Island.

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in pursuance of the provisions of the Copyright Act, 1911, and by virtue of all the powers and authorities therein contained and otherwise me thereunto enabling, do hereby proclaim the said Act (except the provisions thereof expressly restricted to the United Kingdom) to be in full force and operation as law within this Isle from the date of this Proclamation.
