### Places of Detention for Children and Young Persons.

---

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has been pleased to appoint the following place a Place of Detention, as from 1st October, 1912, under the provisions of the Children Act, 1910, for Children and Young Persons committed for detention under that Act:—

A self-contained Suite of Four Rooms, situate at the Court House, Douglas, on the top floor, and containing accommodation for six children.

His Excellency has been further pleased to appoint Mr. John Cain, late Superintendent of Police, to have the care and custody of children and young persons committed to such place of detention, and to declare that 29, Burnside Terrace, Douglas, will cease to be a place of detention from October 1st, 1912.
