



DISEASES OF ANIMALS.

The attention of Farmers and others is directed to the Order of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, dated March 5th, 1912, which compels, under penalties imposed by the Cattle Diseases Acts, the immediate reporting to the nearest Police Station of cases of "animals" labouring under or having any symptom of "disease."

The words "animal" and "disease" are defined in the Order named.

Since a symptom of disease is created by the sudden death of an animal which a short time before appeared to be well, such a case must be immediately reported to the nearest Police Station; and the carcass of an animal so dying must not be removed until it has been inspected by the Veterinary Inspector acting for the Government.
