



## Wireless Telegraph Stations.

---

Public attention is directed to the Wireless Telegraphy Act, 1904 (an Act of the Imperial Parliament), which makes it an offence for any person to establish a wireless telegraph station, or to instal or work any apparatus for wireless telegraphy, without a licence granted in that behalf by the Postmaster-General.

The establishment, without a licence, of such station or apparatus within the Isle of Man renders the person offending liable to a penalty of £100, or to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for twelve months, and to the forfeiture, in either case, of the apparatus.
