



CHILDREN (EMPLOYMENT ABROAD) ACT, 1913.

Attention is directed to the above-named Act of the Imperial Parliament, which makes it illegal—

- (1) for a person to cause, procure, or, having the custody, to allow a child under 14 years of age, other than a child temporarily resident in the United Kingdom, to go out of the United Kingdom to the Isle of Man for the purpose of singing, playing, performing, or being exhibited for profit:
- (2) for a person to cause, procure, or, having the custody, to allow a young person (*i.e.*, a person of between 14 and 16 years of age) other than a young person temporarily resident in the United Kingdom, to go out of the United Kingdom to the Isle of Man for the purposes above enumerated, unless licensed by a magistrate of the Metropolitan Police Court in Bow Street, in accordance with the terms of the Act.
