



FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.

STOPPAGE OF IMPORTATION OF ANIMALS FROM IRELAND.

Owing to an outbreak of Foot-and-Mouth Disease having occurred in Ireland, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has issued, under authority of the Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1865, an Order dated the 20th July, 1914, prohibiting for the present, until further orders, the importation from Ireland into the Isle of Man of any Bull, Cow, Ox, Heifer, Steer, Calf, Sheep, Swine, or Goat.
