



IMPORTATION OF ANIMALS FROM IRELAND.

ON and after Wednesday, the 19th instant, provided no further outbreak of foot-and-mouth disease occurs in Ireland in the meantime, applications may be made to the Government Office for permits to import animals from Ireland into the Isle of Man for all purposes.

Animals so imported will be subject, for the present, to 96 hours' detention at the Government Lairs, Douglas, after the expiration of which period they will, if healthy, be allowed to be slaughtered forthwith at the Public Abattoirs, Douglas, or to be removed into the Island on licence.
