



Importation of Animals from Great Britain.

NOTWITHSTANDING the outbreak of foot-and-mouth disease in the neighbourhood of Grimsby, applications may be made to the Government Office for permits to import animals from other districts in Great Britain into the Isle of Man for all purposes.

Animals so imported will be subject, for the present, to 10 hours detention at the Government Lairs, Douglas, after the expiration of which period they will, if healthy, be allowed to be slaughtered forthwith at the Public Abattoirs, Douglas, or to be removed into the Island on licence.
