



CULTIVATION OF GARDEN PRODUCE.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR desires to call the attention of all interested in the cultivation of food plants, to the desirability of making the fullest use possible of any opportunity which they may have of increasing the production of all useful vegetables during the coming seasons.

White turnips may be sown in August to yield a profitable crop during autumn and early winter, and cabbages, leeks, curled greens, and broccoli can also be planted or transplanted in August and September, so as to be of use in the following winter.

Peas, beans, and potatoes should be as extensively grown as the limits of the land available allow. Everything points to the necessity of an increased production of the simpler and less expensive foods.
