



## CIVIL OFFICERS JOINING THE COLOURS.

As doubt appears to exist in some cases as to the scheme of apportionment for pay laid down by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury and by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor to govern cases where a civil officer drawing pay from the Public Revenue joins the colours for the period of the War, the following is circulated for general information.

A civil officer, from the date of his joining the colours, receives his civil pay, less his military pay and allowances, which allowances, in the case of a married man, shall include those paid to his wife and family.
