



DISEASES IN ANIMALS.

The attention of farmers and others concerned is directed to Government Circulars Nos. 28 and 38.

In the former Circular, notice is given that it is an offence under the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, involving liability to a fine of **£20** to fail to notify to the nearest Police Station a case of Anthrax, Cattle-Plague, Foot-and-Mouth Disease, Glanders and Farcy, Rabies, Epizootic Lymphangitis, Parasitic Mange (Sarcoptic and Psoroptic), Pleuro-Pneumonia, Sheep-Pox, Sheep-Scab, and Swine Fever.

In the second Circular, a warning is given that it is an offence under the Local Government Amendment Act, 1894, involving a penalty of **£5** for the occupier of a place where Milk, Butter, or Cheese is produced for sale, to fail to notify the appearance of **ANY DISEASE** amongst cattle in such place.
