



EXTINCTION OF LIGHTS.

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has issued an Order, a copy of which is appended, under Regulation 11 of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, requiring that on and after April 19th, 1915, all lights, whether public or private, which, if unobscured, would be visible from the sea, to be extinguished, or, in the case of indoor lights, obscured so as to be invisible from outside. The Order further requires that the lights carried on Motor Cars and other vehicles shall not be of greater brightness than is necessary for the public safety.

The Orders made by His Excellency, as Competent Military Authority, on the 11th and 16th February, as printed in Government Circulars Nos. 120 and 122 cease to operate after April 19th, 1915.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM.

REGULATION II.

In pursuance of the power conferred on me by the Secretary of State under Regulation 11 of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, I hereby make the following Order :—

1. All lights, whether public or private, which, if unobscured, would be visible from the sea, shall be extinguished, or, in the case of indoor lights, obscured so as to be invisible from outside :

Provided that this paragraph shall not apply to indispensable navigation or

railway lights, or to lights used in connection with a Detention Camp for prisoners of war, or to any light which is approved by a Competent Naval or Military Authority.

2. The lights carried on motor cars and other vehicles shall not be of greater brightness than is necessary for the public safety.

This Order shall take effect on and after Monday, April 19th, and shall apply to all places in the Isle of Man, where any light, if unobscured, would be visible from the sea, and to the period between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise.
