



LOYAL MANX VOLUNTEER CORPS.

1. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has approved of the Loyal Manx Association being affiliated to the Central Association of Volunteer Training Corps, and being known in future as "the Loyal Manx Volunteer Corps."

2. The Rules of the 21st August, 1914, for the conduct of the Loyal Manx Association will continue to operate for the Loyal Manx Volunteer Corps so long as they do not conflict with the Regulations for Volunteer Training Corps.

3. In consideration of the Corps undertaking to continue to perform special Guard Duty at Douglas Detention Camp, 300 of its members will be clothed in the recognized uniform for Volunteer Training Corps at the Government expense. The uniform will be the property of the Government, and members of the Corps to whom it is issued will be required to give an undertaking that they will continue, during the period of the war, to perform guard duties over prisoners of war (unless relieved from their obligation by the Commandant) and such other duties as may be required of them, provided such duties do not interfere with their means of livelihood. The question of the number of members to be drawn from each district for Guards at the Detention Camp will be determined by the Lieutenant-Governor.

4. Members of the Loyal Manx Volunteer Corps, if they wish, may wear their Corps uniform in their daily occupations,

5. A Government ration allowance of 1s. daily per man will be given in respect of each man who performs Camp guard duty. Of this sum 2d. may be retained by the Executive Committee to defray incidental expenses connected with the Corps.

6. The travelling expenses of men proceeding on guard duty will be defrayed by the Government.
