



Closing of Licensed Premises on Sundays to Bona fide Travellers and Members of His Majesty's Forces.

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Competent Military Authority, has issued an order (a copy of which is appended) dated the 10th July, 1915, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, (1) prohibiting the sale by Publicans of intoxicating liquor on Sundays to bona fide travellers, and (2) closing public houses to all Members of His Majesty's Forces during the whole day on Sundays, except to such members as may be on such premises under authority of a permit issued from the Government Office.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (CONSOLIDATION) REGULATIONS, 1914.

REGULATION 10.

By virtue of the powers vested in me by Regulation No 10 of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, I, being a Competent Military Authority, do hereby make the following Order :—

1. That no Publican, being the holder of a General Public House Licence, shall sell intoxicating liquor on Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday, to any bona fide traveller.
2. That no publican shall suffer or permit any Member of His Majesty's Forces to be on any premises licensed for the sale of intoxicating liquor, for any purpose, at any time during the whole day on Sundays, except such members of His Majesty's Forces as may be on such premises under authority of a permit issued by, or by authority of the Lieutenant-Governor.
