



Restrictions on the Cruising of Yachts and Pleasure Boats.

ON and after August 1st, 1915, the Naval Authorities will permit Yachts and Pleasure Boats to proceed to sea from the Ports of Port St. Mary, Port Erin, and Laxey, within the limits of a two mile radius respectively from the Pier Head of each Port.

Cruising will only be permitted between sunrise and one hour after sunset, and the owner of every Yacht or Pleasure Boat proceeding to sea, must be in possession of a special Licence, issued for the purpose by Authority of the Lieutenant-Governor.

Applications for Licences, which are independent of those issued by the Harbour Commissioners, must be made in writing, giving full particulars as to the vessel or boat, and must be addressed to the Government Secretary, Government Office, Isle of Man.
