



Maintenance of Live Stock (Isle of Man) Act, 1915.

His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor, by virtue of powers vested in him under the above-named Act, has issued an Order (a copy of which is appended) restricting the slaughtering of Animals in-calf or in-pig.

Maintenance of Live Stock (Isle of Man) Act, 1915.

I, THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR of the Isle of Man, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me under the Maintenance of Live Stock (Isle of Man) Act, 1915, and for the purpose of maintaining a sufficient stock of cattle and swine, do hereby order as follows:—

RESTRICTION ON SLAUGHTER OF ANIMALS IN-CALF OR IN-PIG.

1. An animal which is visibly or obviously in-calf or in-pig shall not be slaughtered, or be caused or permitted by its owner to be slaughtered.

EXEMPTIONS FROM RESTRICTIONS.

2. The restrictions of slaughter imposed by the preceding Article of this Order shall not apply to—

- (a) Slaughter of an animal under the powers conferred by the Cattle Diseases Acts, or any Order made thereunder; or
- (b) Slaughter of an animal necessary or desirable on account of accidental injury to the animal or its illness; or
- (c) Slaughter of an animal if in the opinion of the Lieut.-Governor the slaughter is desirable for any exceptional reason or purpose, and the slaughter is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector under the Cattle Diseases Acts.

POWERS OF ENTRY.

3. For the purpose of executing and enforcing this Order any officer appointed by the Lieut.-Governor under the Cattle Diseases Acts, or any Officer appointed by the Local Government Board under the Local Government Acts, may, subject to any directions given by the Lieut.-Governor, and upon production, if so required, of his appointment, enter any slaughter-house or other premises on which animals are slaughtered for human food, and examine any animals or carcases therein; and any officer of a local authority shall, subject to any directions given by the local authority, have the like power of entry of premises in the district of the local authority in addition to any power of entry which he is otherwise entitled to exercise.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the 20th day of September, 1915.

SHORT TITLE.

5. This Order may be cited as "The Maintenance of Live Stock Order of 1915."
