



DEFENCE OF THE REALM.

HIS MAJESTY THE KING, by an Order in Council under the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, dated 30th November, 1915, has been graciously pleased to extend to the Isle of Man the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, issued by His Majesty by Orders in Council dated the 28th September, 1915, and the 14th October, 1915, subject to the following adaptations:—

1. *In the Regulations of the 24th September, 1915—*

For Regulation 6B the following provision shall be substituted:—

“The Lieutenant-Governor may (notwithstanding that the provisions of the Dangerous Goods Act, 1871 to 1894, have not been complied with (grant licences for the establishment of new or the alteration of existing factories and magazines for gunpowder and other explosives intended for war purposes, and any licence so granted shall, during the continuance of the present War, have the like effect as if such licence had been obtained in manner provided by those Acts.”

In Regulation 30A, after the words “United Kingdom” there shall be read the words “or the Isle of Man.”

2. *In the Regulations of the 14th October, 1915—*

In Regulation 18B, after the words “United Kingdom” there shall be read the words “or the Isle of Man.”
