## THE MILITARY SERVICE (ISLE OF MAN) ACT, 1916.

### Certified Occupations.

---

WHEREAS it is provided by section 2 sub-section 2 of the Military Service (Isle of Man) Act, 1916, that Certificates of Exemption from the provisions of such Act may be granted by any Government Department, after consultation with the Army Council, to men or classes or bodies of men in the service or employment of that Department, or, in cases where it appears to the Department that certificates can be more conveniently granted by the Department than by the Local Tribunals to men or classes or bodies of men who are employed or engaged, or qualified for employment or engagement, in any work which is certified by the Department to be work of national importance, and whose exemption comes within the sphere of the Department :

And for the purpose of such Act, the expression "Government Department" and "Department" includes any public administrative department under the control of the Lieutenant-Governor :

And whereas Government Departments of the Imperial Government have certified that the work of men in certain occupations is work of national importance, and that, subject to the provisions as to individual certificates contained in regulations to be issued under the Act, the classes or bodies of men who are employed or engaged in such occupations are exempted from the provisions of the Act :

NOW, I, the Deputy-Governor do hereby certify that the work of men of the kind so certified, from time to time, by the Government Departments of the Imperial Government as work of national importance shall be deemed to be work of national importance within the meaning of the Military Service (Isle of Man) Act, 1916, and that, subject to the provisions as to individual certificates contained in regulations to be issued under such Act, the classes or bodies of men who are employed or engaged in these occupations are exempted from the provisions of the Act.

#### NOTE.

Any man whose principal and usual occupation is one of those in the list so certified, and who wishes to be exempted from the provisions of the Act, must obtain an individual certificate of exemption by applying to the Local Tribunal.

A certificate held on the 24th day of March, 1916, in connection with an Admiralty, War Office, or War Service badge is a certificate of exemption, and a man holding such a certificate need not ordinarily apply for a certificate to the Local Tribunal on grounds connected with employment.

All certificates of exemption are liable to review in accordance with the Act and the Regulations.
