A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Bankers Act, 1872, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor of the Island, from time to time as the Governor may see fit by Proclamation, to appoint a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday.

Now, I, the said Deputy-Governor, by virtue of the power and authority in me vested, do hereby appoint Saturday, the 22nd day of April, 1916, to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout this Isle.
