



LOCAL GOVERNMENT CONSOLIDATION ACT, 1916.

Compulsory Notification of Erysipelas.

In view of cases of erysipelas having arisen in the Island, HIS EXCELLENCY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR has issued an Order, dated the 12th of February, 1920 (a copy of which is appended) declaring Erysipelas to be an Infectious Disease for the purposes of the Local Government Consolidation Act, 1916.

Any case of erysipelas which may arise will therefore require to be notified immediately to the proper Authority, in accordance with the provisions of the above Act.

Parents and guardians of children are especially warned that they, as well as Medical Practitioners, are responsible under the above Act for causing notifications to be made at once of the presence of infectious disease in the children under their care.

Any person offending against the provisions of the above Act in regard to notification of Infectious Disease shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

A PROCLAMATION.

INFECTIOUS DISEASE.

WHEREAS Infectious Disease is defined in the Local Government Consolidation Act, 1916, to include cholera, smallpox, typhus, typhoid, scarlet, relapsing, continued, and puerperal fever; measles, scarlatina, and diphtheria, and such other diseases as the Governor in Council may from time to time declare for the purposes of such Act to be infectious.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed advisable that Erysipelas be declared to be an infectious disease for the purposes of the said Local Government Consolidation Act, 1916.

AND WHEREAS at a Sitting of the Council held on the 3rd day of February, 1920, it was resolved that Erysipelas should be declared to be an infectious disease for the purposes of the said Act.

NOW THEREFORE, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, DO HEREBY declare Erysipelas to be an infectious disease for the purposes of the said Local Government Consolidation Act, 1916.
