# Flour and Bread.

---

In view of the new scheme in England concerning the subsidization of flour, the following procedure will be adopted for the Isle of Man :—

1. Until April 12th, Manx-milled flour will continue to be supplied to Bakers and Retailers at the present prices.
2. On and after April 12th, the price of flour sold wholesale will be increased by 19/3 per sack.
3. Millers in the Isle of Man are only permitted to issue to their customers normal and usual supplies of flour up to April 12th.
4. On and after April 12th, the subsidy on flour will be revised to correspond with that operating in the United Kingdom.
5. On April 12th, the Flour and Bread Prices Order will be revised. Up to that date retail prices of both flour and bread will remain as at present fixed by law.
6. In the event of Manx millers not having sufficient stocks to satisfy the trade with flour at the present price, up to April 12th, they may be authorized as from the date existing stocks expire to make an additional charge not exceeding 19/3 per sack, and from that date Bakers and Retailers of flour will be able to claim from the Government Treasurer compensation to cover the additional charge per sack imposed by the millers on flour used up to the 12th April.
7. All claims for compensation in respect of English and Manx milled flour, invoiced at increased rates and used between the 15th March and the 10th April, must be made on the form to be supplied from Government Office, and must reach the Government Office not later than the 15th April.

The applicant will be required to give the following particulars on the form :—

- (1.) Name and address.
- (2.) Name and address of miller, factor, or dealer from whom flour was purchased.
- (3.) Particulars of invoices of consignments of flour in respect of which or part of which compensation is claimed.
- (4.) Total weight of flour upon which compensation is claimed.
- (5.) Balance of stocks in hands of the applicant at the close of business on 10th April.

The form must be signed by the applicant and certified by two responsible ratepayers, not in the trade.
