**COMPULSORY SHEEP DIPPING.**

---

The attention of Agriculturists and others is drawn to the Order made by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor dated the 16th August, 1919, of which the following are the chief provisions stated in general terms :—

1. All sheep (except any exempted for special reasons) must be dipped twice each year between the first day of May and the first day of November,
2. Sheep must be dipped by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep dip.
3. Notice must be sent to the Inspector, Government Office, Douglas, at least three clear days before the intended time of dipping. In this notice the time and place of the intended dipping must be stated.
4. If from any cause the dipping of the sheep cannot be carried out on the date specified in the notice the sheep shall be dipped as soon after such date as is practicable. Notice that the postponed dipping has been carried out must be sent immediately after the dipping to the Inspector, Government Office, Douglas.
5. If a sheep is not dipped as required by the Order, the owner or person in charge of such sheep shall according to their respective acts and defaults be deemed guilty of an offence against the Cattle Diseases (Prevention) Acts.
6. If any person fails to give any notice required by the Order he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Cattle Diseases (Prevention) Acts.
