A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, by section 2 of the Sea Gull Preservation Amendment Act, 1917, the Lieutenant-Governor is empowered at any time, by proclamation, to suspend the operation of, or to modify, the provisions of the Sea Gull Preservation Act, 1867, in whole or in part, for such period of time as by such proclamation should be declared:

And whereas it is desirable that the taking of Sea Gulls' Eggs should be permitted up to and including the 30th day of May, 1920:

NOW, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 2 of the Sea Gull Preservation Amendment Act, 1917, do hereby order and declare that the provisions of the Sea Gull Preservation Act, 1867, prohibiting the taking from the nest of an egg of any gull, or the wilful breaking, spoiling, or destruction of an egg of any gull in the nest, shall be, and the same are hereby suspended up to and including the 30th day of May, 1920.
