MAXIMUM GRAVITY OF BEER.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR has issued an Order (copy of which is appended), dated the 1st April, 1920, prohibiting a Brewer for sale from brewing beer at his brewery which exceeds an original gravity of 1040°.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do hereby order as follows:—

A Brewer for sale shall not brew beer at his brewery which exceeds an original gravity of 1040°.

“Beer” includes ale, porter, spruce beer, black beer, and any other description of beer.

Infringements of this Order are summary offences against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

This Order shall come into operation on the 1st April, 1920.
