**DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.**

***The Intoxicating Liquor Order, 1920.***

HIS EXCELLENCY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR has issued an Order (a copy of which is appended), dated the 21st April, 1920, prohibiting a Brewer for sale from brewing any beer at his brewery except at such original gravities as secure that the average original gravity of all beer brewed by him at that Brewery during any quarter does not exceed 1044°.

The Order cancels the Order dated the 1st April, 1920, made by the Lieutenant-Governor, prohibiting the brewing of beer which exceeds an original gravity of 1040°.

Infringements of this Order are summary offences against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

**DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.**

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do hereby order as follows :—

1. A brewer for sale shall not brew any beer at his Brewery except at such original gravities as secure that the average original gravity of all beer brewed by him at that Brewery during any quarter to which this Order applies does not exceed 1044°.
2. The expression "brewer for sale" shall mean any person who brews beer for the use of any other person at any place other than the premises of the person for whose use the beer shall be brewed, and any person licensed to deal in or retail beer who brews beer.
3. The expression "beer" includes ale, porter, spruce beer, black beer, and any other description of beer.
4. Infringements of this Order are summary offences against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.
5. This Order cancels the Order made by me on the 1st day of April, 1920, prohibiting the brewing of beer which exceeded an original gravity of 1040°.
6. This Order shall apply to the quarter commencing on 1st April, 1920, and until further notice to every succeeding quarter.
7. This Order may be cited as the Intoxicating Liquor Order, 1920.
