



ROYAL VISIT, July 14th and 15th, 1920.

PROGRAMME.

The following details in connection with the Royal Visit are announced for the information of all concerned.

WEDNESDAY, 14th July, 1920.

3 p.m. The Royal Yacht arrives in Douglas Bay. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor with the Government Secretary will proceed on board to report

4 p.m. Their Majesties the King and Queen accompanied by H. R. H. Princess Mary and attended by the Secretary of State, Home Office, and their suites will land at the Victoria Pier, Douglas, and will be received by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, the Members of the Legislature and the Harbour Commissioners together with their principal officials. The Members of the Legislative Council, the Speaker of the House of Keys and the Chairman of the Harbour Commissioners will be presented to His Majesty by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor.

4-5 p.m. A procession of motor cars will be formed as under :—

- 1st motor car—Their Majesties the King and Queen, H. R. H. Princess Mary and His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor.
- 2nd motor car—Mrs Fry, the Secretary of State, Home Office, and an Equerry-in-Waiting.
- 3rd motor car—Two Ladies-in-Waiting and the Private Secretary to the King
- 4th motor car—An Equerry-in-Waiting, the Government Secretary, and the Master of the Household.

The Victoria Pier will be closed to the Public. Admission will be by ticket. Persons to whom tickets are issued must be on the Pier, in the side-walks, at least half-an-hour in advance of the approach of the Royal Party both on coming and going. No vehicles will be allowed to proceed to the Pier Gates.

4-10 p.m. His Majesty the King will inspect Ex-Service Men drawn up between the Victoria Pier and the Peveril Hotel.

4-25 p.m. Their Majesties will arrive at Villa Marina, where they will be received by the Mayor, the Deputy Mayor, and the Town Clerk, who will be presented to Their Majesties by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor. A procession will be formed on arrival and will proceed to the platform as follows.:

1. Mace Bearer.
2. The Town Clerk and Deputy Mayor.
3. The Mayor.
4. The Government Secretary.
5. Their Majesties the King and Queen.
6. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and H.R.H. Princess Mary.
7. The Secretary of State, Home Office, and Mrs Fry.
8. The Suites of Their Majesties the King and Queen.

On arrival on the platform His Majesty the King will receive an Address from the Mayor and Corporation of Douglas, to which His Majesty will reply. The Address will be read by the Town Clerk and presented to His Majesty by the Mayor. The Lieutenant-Governor will then present to Their Majesties the Mayoress, the wives of the Town Clerk and Deputy Mayor, and the Aldermen and their wives. The Councillors and their wives will be present on the platform.

The school children of the Douglas district will be formed up in the grounds of Villa Marina.

Admission to Villa Marina will be by ticket; persons holding tickets must be in their places at least one hour in advance of the arrival of the Royal Party. No vehicles will be allowed to proceed to the entrance of the building.

4-50 p.m. The procession of motor cars will be re-formed and Their Majesties will proceed to the Nunnery for tea via the Promenade, Victoria Street, Ridgeway Street, the North Quay, and the Stone Bridge.

5-20 p.m. The procession will leave the Nunnery and proceed to Castletown via Ballasalla and Malew.

5-30 p.m. The procession will pass the children of Santon District drawn up under the Captain of the Parish.

5-45 p.m. The procession will reach Castletown. The High-Bailiff, the Chairman of the Town Commissioners, and the Town Clerk will be presented to His Majesty by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor.

His Majesty will inspect the Ex-Service Men of the District and the Officers Training Corps of King William's College.

The children of the District will be drawn up.

Their Majesties will visit Castle Rushen (if time permits).

- 6-5 p.m. The procession will leave Castletown.
- 6-10 p.m. The procession will pass children of the Ballasalla District drawn up under the Captain of the Parish at Ballasalla.
- 6-30 p.m. The procession will arrive at the Victoria Pier, Douglas.
- 7 p.m. Their Majesties will re-embark on the Royal Yacht.

THURSDAY, 15th July, 1920.

10-30 a.m. Their Majesties the King and Queen, accompanied by H.R.H. Princess Mary and attended by the Secretary of State, Home Office, and their Suites will arrive at the Victoria Pier, Douglas, where they will be received by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor accompanied by the Government Secretary and the Chief Constable.

- 10-35 a.m. A procession of motor cars will be formed as under :—
- 1st motor car—Their Majesties the King and Queen, H.R.H. Princess Mary, and His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor.
- 2nd motor car—A Lady-in-Waiting, the Secretary of State, Home Office, and an Equerry-in-Waiting.
- 3rd motor car—A Lady-in-Waiting, the Private Secretary to the King, and the Government Secretary.
- 4th motor car—An Equerry-in-Waiting and the Master of the Household.

The procession will proceed to Ramsey via Douglas Promenade and Groudle.

- 11 a.m. The procession will pass children of the Laxey District drawn up under the Captain of the Parish at Laxey.
- 11-15 a.m. The procession will pass children of Maughold drawn up at Dhoon Schoolhouse under the Captain of the Parish.
- 11-30 a.m. The procession will arrive at Ramsey. His Majesty the King will receive an Address from the Town Commissioners of Ramsey, through their Chairman, to whom the Secretary of State, Home Office, will hand a reply. The High-Bailiff, the Chairman of the Town Commissioners and the Town Clerk will be presented to His Majesty by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor. His Majesty will inspect the Ex-Service Men of the North of the Island. The school children of the Ramsey District will be drawn up near the Town Hall.
- 12 noon. The procession will pass the children of the District drawn up at Sulby Glen under the Captain of the Parish.

- 12-5 p.m. The procession will pass the children of Ballaugh District drawn up at Ballaugh under the Captain of the Parish.
- 12-10 p.m. Their Majesties will visit Bishops court.
- 12-25 p.m. The procession will leave Bishops court.
- 12-30 p.m. The procession will pass the children of the Michael District drawn up at Kirk Michael under the Captain of the Parish.
- 12-50 p.m. The procession will arrive at Peel. The Chairman of the Town Commissioners and the Town Clerk will be presented to His Majesty by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor. His Majesty will inspect the Ex-Service Men of the District. The school children of the Peel District will be drawn up.
- 1-10 p.m. The procession will reach St. John's where the school children of the district will be drawn up around Tynwald Hill. His Majesty the King will proceed on to Tynwald Hill.
- 1-20 p.m. The procession will pass the children of the Crosby District drawn up under the Captain of the Parish at Crosby.
- 1-30 p.m. Their Majesties will arrive at Government House for luncheon.
- 3 p.m. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor will give a Garden Party at Government House. The wives of the Members of the Legislative Council will be presented to Their Majesties by His Excellency. The Members of the House of Keys and their wives and certain of the principal Officials and their wives will also be presented to Their Majesties.
- 4-45 p.m. The procession will leave Government House and proceed to the Victoria Pier, Douglas, by way of Onchan, Burnt Mill Hill, and the Promenade.
- 5-30 p.m. Their Majesties will re-embark on the Royal Yacht.
- 6 p.m. The Royal Yacht will sail.
