DOUGLAS SHOP ASSISTANTS' DISPUTE.

AWARD OF ARBITRATION BOARD.

The Lieutenant-Governor has received the Award of the Arbitration Board appointed by His Excellency for determining matters in dispute between the Isle of Man Employers' Federation and the National Amalgamated Union of Shop Assistants, Warehousemen and Clerks.

The Members of the Arbitration Board appointed by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor to arbitrate on the dispute between the Isle of Man Employers' Federation and the National Amalgamated Union of Shop Assistants, Warehousemen and Clerks with regard to wages, make the following award :—

To all Shop Assistants and others specified in the Award of the 24th July, 1919, also Ironmongers' Assistants, an advance of twenty per cent. on the rates shown in that Award, such advance in wages to be retrospective as from the 24th May, 1920, and to be binding on all parties up to the 31st December, 1920, and thereafter subject to one month's notice in writing.
