



MOVEMENT OF SWINE.

1. Under the provisions of the Order published in Government Circular No. 241, a pig may not be moved unless a permit authorizing the movement has been issued by the Police Officer at the nearest Police Station. The following instructions are issued for the guidance of Police Officers in their duties in this connection.

- 2 The form of Police permit will be as heretofore.
3. Pigs may be licensed to a mart. The Mart Owner is required by the provisions of the above Order to keep a register of the names and addresses of the seller and purchaser of every pig brought in. The Police should inspect the register to see that it is properly compiled. Sellers should be advised to keep their pigs isolated from others when at the mart.
4. Pigs may be licensed from one place to another, but (unless they are for immediate slaughter) a Police Officer should not issue a further licence for movement until 14 days have elapsed from the date the pigs arrived in his district.
5. A Sow may be licensed to proceed to and return from the Boar without the 14 days detention specified in (4), provided the Boar is kept isolated from other Pigs at all times.
6. Permits may be issued by the Police without the applicant being required to fill in and sign any declaration form.
