A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, by section 4 of the Bankers' Act, 1872, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor of the Island, from time to time, as the Governor may see fit, by Proclamation to appoint a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday :

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by virtue of the power and authority in me vested, do hereby appoint Thursday, the 15th day of July, 1920, to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout this Isle.
