## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the contagious disease known as Swine Fever at present exists amongst Swine in this Island: And whereas it is necessary to prevent the spread of the disease.

~~assent~~ NOW, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, 1865 to 1903, do hereby order as follows:—

Every boar, pig, hog, or sow which is certified by an Inspector under the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts to be affected with Swine Fever, and every boar, pig, hog, or sow which has been in contact or in association with any boar, pig, hog, or sow which has been so certified shall be slaughtered and disposed of in such manner as the Inspector under the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts may direct.
