DEFENCE OF THE REALM.

The Sugar (Retail Prices) Order, 1920.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR has issued an Order dated 5th November, 1920 (a copy of which is appended), made under the powers afforded by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, directing that on and after November 29th, 1920, until further notice, no Sugar of the quality as described in the Schedule shall be sold by retail in the Isle of Man at a price exceeding 9½d per lb.

Any person acting in contravention of the Order is guilty of a summary offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and is liable to be sentenced to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for a term not exceeding six months, or to a fine not exceeding £100, or to both such imprisonment and fine.

ISLE OF MAN } By His Excellency Major-General Sir William Fry, K.C.V.O.,
TO WIT. } C.B., Lieutenant-Governor of the said Isle, etc., etc.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Lieutenant-Governor hereby orders that except under the authority of the Lieutenant-Governor the following Regulations shall be observed by all persons concerned:—

1. A person shall not sell or offer to buy or agree to buy by retail any sugar as described in the Schedule hereto at a price exceeding the maximum price for the time being applicable under this Order.

2. On and after November 29th, 1920, the maximum price applicable on a sale by retail of sugar falling within Article (1) hereof shall be at the rate of 9½d the pound.

3. (a) No charge may be made for packing or for giving credit.

(b) In estimating the maximum price any broken ½d. shall be reckoned as a ¼d.

4. A person shall not in connection with the sale or disposition or proposed sale or disposition by retail of any sugar, enter or offer to enter into any fictitious or artificial transaction, or make or demand any unreasonable charge.

5. Infringements of this Order are summary offences against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

6. (a) This order may be cited as the Sugar (Retail Prices) Order, 1920.

(b) This Order shall come into force on the 29th November, 1920.
