



Cases for Reformatory and Industrial Schools.

His Excellency desires to inform Justices of the Peace that the Attorney-General has advised that the Children Act 1910 contemplates that the duty of finding accommodation for children committed to Reformatory or Industrial Schools shall still devolve on the Executive Government which was the Authority acting in this respect before the passage of the Act referred to.

Whenever therefore, a child is committed to one of these Institutions in future the Bench should at once notify the Government Secretary in writing and the Government Office will make arrangements as to the Institution to which the child is to be sent, and the Bench will then be informed of the name of the Institution so that the Warrant of Commitment may be completed.

While these negotiations are proceeding, the Bench should either order the child to remain with its parents or commit the child temporarily to the I.o.M. Homes for Orphan and Destitute Children which has been constituted a place of Detention under the provisions of the Children Act 1910.

As soon as the Warrant of Commitment to the Reformatory or Industrial School has been completed it should be forwarded to the Government Secretary who will arrange with the Police for the removal of the child.
