DEFENCE OF THE REALM.

Free Exportation of Oats, Wheat, Barley and Animals (except In-Calf Heifers and Cows).

HIS EXCELLENCY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR has, under the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, made an Order (a copy of which is appended), dated the 2nd December, 1920, revoking as from the 4th December, 1920, the Order of the 7th March, 1917, so far as it relates to the exportation of Oats; the Order of the 9th March, 1917, relating to the exportation of Wheat and Barley; and the Export of Live Stock (Prohibition) Order, 1918, so far as it relates to the exportation of animals (with the exception of in-calf Heifers and Cows of all classes.

Oats, wheat, barley, and animals (except in-calf heifers and cows of all classes) may now be exported from the Isle of Man without a Government Office permit.

Permits must still be obtained from Government Office before any exportation of potatoes, in-calf heifers, and cows of all classes can take place.

Whilst no permit from Government Office is necessary to enable pigs to be exported, it is still necessary for an exporter who desires to send pigs off the Island to obtain a licence from the Police, under the Swine Fever (Movement from Isle of Man) Orders.

*ISLE OF MAN

BY HIS EXCELLENCY MAJOR-GENERAL SIR WILLIAM FRY,
K.C.V.O., C.B., LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR OF THE SAID ISLE, etc.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor do hereby order that the Order made by the Lieutenant-Governor on the 7th day of March, 1917, so far only as it relates to the exportation of Oats from the Isle of Man; the Order made by the Lieutenant-Governor on the 9th day of March, 1917, prohibiting the exportation of Barley and Wheat from the Isle of Man; and the Order made by the Lieutenant-Governor on the 20th day of April, 1918, entitled the Export of Live Stock (Prohibition) Order, 1918, except in so far as such Order relates to the exportation from the Isle of Man of Heifers in calf and all classes of Cows, which said Heifers and Cows may be exported only under the authority of a licence issued by the Government Secretary, shall be, and the same are hereby revoked and cancelled as from the 4th day of December, 1920, without prejudice to any proceedings which may subsequently be taken in respect of any contravention of the Order or portions of Orders hereby revoked prior to their revocation,
