## **PEEL SCARLET FEVER EPIDEMIC.**

---

The Lieutenant-Governor and the Local Government Board have issued an Order dated 24th December, 1920 (a copy of which is appended), made under the provisions of the Local Government (Consolidation) Act, 1916, dealing with assemblages of persons in Peel.

1. No person under the age of 16 years shall be admitted to any performance in Kinema Houses and Theatres.
2. All Day and Sunday Schools are to remain closed.
3. No person under the age of 16 years shall be admitted to any public meeting, gathering, private or subscription parties, dances or other entertainments.

The Order remains operative until 21st January, 1921.

## A PROCLAMATION

---

The Local Government Board for the Isle of Man having made Regulations in the following terms:—

WHEREAS the town of Peel appears to be affected by a formidable epidemic disease commonly called Scarlet Fever, which threatens to become more serious.

AND WHEREAS WE, the Local Government Board with a view to preventing, mitigating, and guarding against the spreading of such disease are of opinion that regulations are required.

NOW THEREFORE, WE, the Local Government Board in exercise of the powers conferred upon us by Section 195 of the Local Government Consolidation Act, 1916, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf, do hereby make the following regulations, that is to say:—

IN THE CASE OF KINEMA HOUSES AND THEATRES.

No person under 16 years of age shall be admitted to any performance therein.

IN THE CASE OF DAY AND SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

All Day and Sunday Schools, shall be and remain closed, and before being re-opened shall be properly cleansed and disinfected.

IN THE CASE OF SCHOOLS AND HALLS.

No person under the age of 16 years shall be admitted to any public meeting, gathering, private or subscription parties, dances, or other entertainments.

These regulations shall be in force in the town of Peel for the period from the date hereof to the 21st January, 1921, both days inclusive, and shall be enforced and executed by the Local Government Board Inspectors.

Given at Douglas, this 24th day of December, 1920.

Now I, the Lieutenant-Governor, by virtue of the power and authority in me vested, do hereby order and direct that due observance of the said Regulations be had throughout this Isle.
