* A Civil Servant for this purpose is an officer, other than a Police or Prison Officer, employed in the permanent service of the Government of the Island, and whose salary is paid from the Public Revenue by the Treasurer of the Island.

Applications from officers for the above allowances must be made, in writing, on the prescribed form, to the Government Secretary, and be supported by the signature of the head of their department.

Cabs, postages, telegrams, and all necessary outlay incidental to the special duty on which an officer is detailed to be in addition.

Officers in grades (1) and (2) are entitled to first-class railway and boat fares. Officers in grades (3) and (4) are entitled to first-class boat fare and third-class railway fare.
