## DEFENCE OF THE REALM.

---

### ***The Flour and Bread (Returns) Order, 1921.***

---

HIS EXCELLENCY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR having issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm Regulations an Order dated 24th March, 1921 (a copy of which is appended), termed the Flour and Bread (Returns) Order, 1921, the following Direction is issued for compliance by all concerned.

1. Millers, Bakers, and other retailers of flour are required to furnish to the Government Secretary on Form Q. 3. (which is now in course of distribution) a return of Stocks, etc., held at the close of business on Thursday, 31st March, 1921. This form must be completed and posted or taken to the Government Office before midnight Saturday, 2nd April, 1921.

2. Failure to comply with this Direction is a summary offence under the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

## FLOUR AND BREAD (RETURNS) ORDER, 1921.

---

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Lieutenant-Governor hereby orders that except under the authority of the Lieutenant-Governor the following regulations shall be observed viz :—

1. Millers, bakers, retailers of flour and all other persons affected by this Order shall make all such returns as to stocks, sales, payments, prices, dealings in or consumption of flour or bread, as shall from time to time be required by or under the authority of the Lieutenant-Governor.

2. A person shall not—

- (a) Knowingly make or connive at the making of any false statement in any return required to be made under this Order or in any enquiry held for the purposes of this Order,
- (b) Forge or alter any authority, or other document issued in connection with or for the purpose of this Order ; or
- (c) Personate or falsely represent himself to be a person to whom such authority or other document has been issued or applies.

3. A person employed by the Lieutenant-Governor shall not without lawful authority communicate to any person any information acquired by him from any application made or enquiry held in connection with or for the purposes of this Order.

4. If any question arises whether flour is proprietary flour or whether bread is proprietary bread, such question shall be determined by the Lieutenant-Governor.

5. For the purposes of this Order :—

“Flour” shall mean any wheat meal or wheaten flour, or any flour milled from wheat.

“Home-milled flour” shall mean any flour manufactured in the United Kingdom.

“Self-raising flour” shall mean flour containing such ingredients that the flour when mixed with water forms a dough which aerates itself.

6. Infringements of this Order are summary offences against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

7. This Order may be cited as the Flour and Bread (Returns) Order, 1921.
