***Notice by Married Women of Ownership of
Furniture in Dwelling House.***

On the 12th July, 1921, the Governor in Council made an Order (copy appended) prescribing under Section 4B of the above-named Act, the form of Notice to be registered in the Registry of Deeds, Finch Road, Douglas, by a Married Woman as to her ownership of furniture in the house (not being a house where a business is carried on) in which the husband and wife reside.

Section 4B is fully set out in the Order.

MARRIED WOMEN'S PROPERTY, DOWER AND WIDOWRIGHT
ACT, 1921.

Order of the Governor in Council dated 12th day of July, 1921, prescribing the Form of Notice required to be given to the Registrar of Deeds under Section 4B of the above-named Act.

WHEREAS by Section 4B of the said Act it is provided that where a wife is the owner of the whole or any part of the furniture in the house (not being a house where a business is carried on) in which the husband and wife reside, she shall not be entitled to claim such furniture as against the creditors of the husband unless she has registered in the Registry Office for Deeds in the Register of the Parish where such house is situate a notice in the form prescribed by the Governor in Council that such furniture is her property.

The Registrar of Deeds shall keep a special register for such purpose, and a fee of five shillings shall be charged for the registration of such notice.

Such register shall be open for inspection during the hours when the Registry Office for Deeds is open to the public, and any notice registered under this Act may be inspected on payment of a fee of one shilling.

Now the Governor in Council doth prescribe and direct that the form hereafter set forth shall be used for the purpose of the said Act.
