



CATTLE DISEASES PREVENTION ACTS.

***Importation of Hay, Straw and Peat-Moss Litter.***

In view of the shortage of fodder in the Isle of Man, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, in consultation with the Board of Agriculture for the Isle of Man, has made an Order under the provisions of the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, dated 7th February, 1922 (a copy of which is appended), revoking the Orders made on the 24th February, 1914, and permitting the importation of hay, straw and peat-moss litter into the Island by dealers and others under permit issued from the Government Office.

In consequence of the existence of a serious outbreak of Foot-and-Mouth Disease in Great Britain, permits will only be issued for the time being for importation via the port of Southampton, and only hay and straw purchased from Messrs Drew & Sons, of Devizes, will be licensed.

Forms of application for permits may be obtained from Government Office.

Order of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor (dated the 7th February, 1922).

**THE HAY, STRAW, AND PEAT-MOSS LITTER (IMPORTATION)  
ORDER, 1922.**

WHEREAS it is deemed advisable to modify the Orders for regulating the importation of hay, straw, and peat-moss litter into this Island.

NOW I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, and in exercise of all the powers in that behalf given by the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, do hereby order as follows:—

1. No hay, straw, or peat-moss litter, or any other substance used in substitution for straw for bedding animals shall be imported into this Island unless accompanied by a Permit issued by the Government Secretary, which Permit may contain such conditions as may at the time of issue be considered desirable.

2. This Order shall not apply to:—

- (a) Hay or straw which at the time of importation is being used for packing merchandise; or
- (b) Manufactured straw not intended for use as fodder or litter for animals.

3. The Hay and Straw (Landing) Order of 1914, dated the 24th February, 1914, and the Peat-Moss Litter (Landing) Order of 1914, dated 24th February, 1914, are hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as "The Hay, Straw, and Peat-Moss Litter (Importation) Order of 1922."
