



Dogs (Importation) Revocation Order, 1922.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR has issued an Order under the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, dated the 7th February, 1922 (a copy of which is appended), revoking the orders prohibiting the importation of Dogs into the Isle of Man from Great Britain and the Channel Islands. Dogs may be imported into the Isle of Man from Great Britain, Ireland and the Channel Islands without restriction.

ORDER OF HIS EXCELLENCY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR.

DOGS (IMPORTATION) REVOCATION ORDER OF 1922.

I, the Lieutenant Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, and under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, 1865 to 1903, and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, hereby order as follows :-

1. The Dogs (Importation) Order, 1918 and the Dogs (Importation) No. 2 Order of 1918, and any existing Order amending those Orders are hereby revoked.

2. This Order may be cited as the Dogs (Importation) Revocation Order of 1922.
