



## **CUSTOMS DUTIES.**

HIS EXCELLENCY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR under the powers contained in Sub-section (5) of Section 5 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1921, has made an Order (a copy of which is appended), dated the 24th February, 1922, exempting from the charge of *Ad Valorem* duty in the Island, mouth organs and all complete musical instruments the value of which does not exceed one shilling.

ORDER, dated the 24th day of February, 1922, made by Major-General Sir William Fry, K.C.V.O., C.B., Lieutenant-Governor of the Isle of Man, under Section 5 (5) of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1921 (11 and 12 Geo. V.c. 40).

---

WHEREAS it is provided by Sub-section (5) of Section 5 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1921, that the Lieutenant-Governor of the Isle of Man may by Order exempt any articles mentioned in the Order which are liable to duty under that section from that duty if he is satisfied that, having regard to the small value of the articles, it is inexpedient that the duty should be charged.

AND WHEREAS, having regard to the small value of the articles specified in the Schedule to this Order, it is inexpedient that the duty imposed by the said Section should be charged on those articles.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in pursuance of the power conferred on me by the said Sub-section (5) hereby order as follows :—

“The articles mentioned in the Schedule to this Order shall be exempt from the duty imposed on the said articles by Sub-section (1) of the said Section 5.”

### **SCHEDULE.**

The following musical instruments, that is to say :—

- (1) Mouth Organs.
- (2) All complete musical instruments the value of which does not exceed one shilling.
